Just as we take our children to the doctor for their annual medical checkups, our Scholars also receive annual academic check-ups when they take the TN Ready assessment each year. The TN Ready assessment is design to evaluate your child's true understanding of English/Language arts, math, science, and social studies, not just rote memorization and test-taking skills. This school year, the assessment will be administered between April 16th and May 4th.

Like annual medical check-ups, Scholars and parents feel a degree of anxiety when it comes to taking the TN Ready assessment. To ease the anxiety that you and your child may feel, we are recommending the following websites for preparing for and staying up-to-date about TN Ready:
